Once a month they provide educational events in communities around Northern and Central California.

The American Civil War Association of California invites the public to a weekend of **Civil War Reenactments and Encampment at Warms Springs Dam in Healdsburg on Saturday April 17th and Sunday April 18thth, 2004**. Soldiers and civilians representing both North and South will camp and live in authentic period style. **Battles Reenactments are scheduled for 1 p.m. and 4 p.m. on Saturday, and 11 a.m. and 2 a.m. on Sunday. All events are subject to weather conditions.**

Camps will be open to the public on Saturday from 9:00 am to 6:00 pm and again on Sunday from 9:00 am until 3:00 pm. Living history demonstrations and displays will be held throughout the weekend. This is a great chance to meet and talk to your soldiers in the field and see their living conditions.

Admission is free. Donations are gratefully accepted.
